A Will bequest is one of the easiest deferred gifts. Including **UNC Greensboro** as a beneficiary in your Will (or in your Revocable Trust) is one of the best ways to make a gift to the University while maintaining the availability of your assets during your lifetime.

A Will or Trust bequest to UNC Greensboro often provides a full dollar-for-dollar estate tax charitable deduction under both federal and North Carolina law, and can thereby provide significant estate tax savings for your other beneficiaries. You can bequeath various types of assets to the University including a specific gift of cash, securities, real estate, or even personal property.

About The University of North Carolina at Greensboro

Founded in 1891, UNC Greensboro is a constituent institution of the University of North Carolina. Gifts to the University generally qualify as charitable contributions, which are deductible for federal income, estate, and gift tax purposes.

Sample Will Bequest Language

1. Specific Bequest – a gift of a specific dollar amount, or of specific property such as stocks, bonds, mutual funds, or real estate (such property described with particularity):

“I give the sum of _____dollars (\$ _____) to The University of North Carolina at Greensboro, identified by federal taxpayer identification number 56-6001468, an educational institution with its principal office located in Greensboro, North Carolina, for its general uses and purposes.”

Or

“I give all of my right, title, and interest in that certain parcel of real property described below to The University of North Carolina at Greensboro, identified by federal taxpayer identification number 56-6001468, an educational institution with its principal office located in Greensboro, North Carolina, for its general uses and purposes, said real property more particularly described as follows:... [Insert the legal description from your deed here].”

2. Residuary Bequest – a gift, usually expressed as a percentage, from the “rest, remainder, and residue” of your estate (that portion of your estate remaining after all other dispositions have been made):

“I give _____ % of my residuary estate to The University of North Carolina at Greensboro, identified by federal taxpayer identification number 56-6001468, an educational institution with its principal office located in Greensboro, North Carolina, for its general uses and purposes.”
